## Try the Train rail confidence trips

In October and November we ran our first Try the Train programme with a group of participants from Working for Health.

Try the Train was developed by Community Rail Lancashire and consists of a series of workshops and trips with the aim of equipping the participants with the skills and confidence to be able to use the railway safely and independently.

The participants learned how to purchase tickets, use stations safely, find help when needed and how to save money and make rail travel more affordable. The trips to Bridlington and York were enjoyed by all and by the end of the programme all felt confident enough to be able to use the trains by themselves in the future. One man said: 'I was in a bad place after all I have been through but these trips have changed my life, thank you'





### **Schools Rail Safety Station event**

In September we helped at a two day Station safety education event in Hull.

The event which was run by Network Rail with Hull Trains, Northern, Transpennine Express, BTP and the Railway Children welcomed around 100 children from three schools to Hull Paragon station and Hull Trains Learning & Development Academy.

The students experienced a range of activities including a simulator experience, virtual reality headsets, rail safety videos and a look at a BTP police vehicle!

They learned all about how to keep safe on the railway, as well as the different careers that are available in the rail industry. They were all really engaged and went away promising to share the safety messages with their friends and families.

## A new NER Tiled map for Driffield

On 29th October we unveiled our new NER tiled map on Driffield station. Driffield in Bloom kindly hosted the event and provided hot drinks and cakes for all in the waiting room.

These new maps are made in the same factory and by the same processes that the original ones were back in the 1900s which makes them very special.

These are fantastic achievements by all these volunteer groups whose work in keeping the stations looking beautiful all year round is appreciated by us all.
