The Yorkshire Coast Line connects the seaside resorts of Scarborough, Filey and Bridlington with historic market towns Beverley and Driffield and of course the city of Hull and all that it has to offer.

The hourly trains from Scarborough continue through from Hull to Doncaster, Meadowhall and Sheffield.
An hourly service from Bridlington to York via Hull means that there are two trains per hour in both directions between Bridlington and Hull, Monday - Saturday.
On Sundays there is an hourly service in both directions between Scarborough and Hull for most of the day.

Travelling by train offers you the opportunity to sit back and enjoy the wonderful scenery of the coast and Yorkshire Wolds.

Buying a ticket

Buy your ticket before boarding the train at a booking office, vending machine, app or online. It is possible to get a promise to pay ticket from a vending machine and pay on the train if you have not got the facility to pay by credit/debit card.

A range of tickets are available including singles, returns, rangers and rovers.

Discounts are available if you purchase tickets in advance, have a valid railcard, or if 2 people are travelling together. Groups of 10 or more can benefit from discounts with a group booking.

Hourly direct trains from Scarborough to Meadowhall, Doncaster and Sheffield via Hull.

Hourly direct trains to York from Bridlington via Hull

Direct trains to Leeds, Halifax, York, Manchester, Liverpool and London from Hull.

Direct trains to York and Manchester from Scarborough and Seamer.

Bus connections

From Scarborough station:

Arriva X93 to Whitby and Middlesborough via Scarborough hospital.

Arriva X94 to Whitby via Peasholm Park.

East Yorkshire buses 128 to Helmsley, Pickering and Kirbymoorside.

East Yorkshire's red open top bus service runs between Scarborough station and North and South bays during Summer.

East Yorkshire buses 12 and 13 run between Scarborough Filey and Bridlington via some holiday camps. 13 is seasonal.

Also from Bridlington :

East Yorkshire buses 14 to Flamborough North Landing via Sewerby.

East Yorkshire buses 41 to Driffield via Burton Agnes Hall.

East Yorkshire buses 130 to Hornsea via Skipsea and the holiday camps.

East Yorkshire buses 136 to Driffield via Skipsea and the coast.

Scarborough is the jewel of the Yorkshire Coast with its vast range of attractions. These include boat trips, cliff railways, a superb park (with miniature railway!), the castle and lots more.



Filey is a picturesque seaside town known for its sandy beaches, beautiful flower displays and the Brigg which is a rocky peninsular at the North end of Filey Bay that can be explored at low tide.



RSPB **Bempton Cliffs** is home to one of the UK's top wildlife spectacles. Around half a million seabirds gather here between March and August to raise a family on the towering chalk cliffs that overlook the North Sea.



Bridlington is a friendly seaside resort on the Yorkshire Coast. With its miles of sandy beaches, glorious promenades complete with their own land trains, the historic Old Town and priory and fascinating working harbour it has something to please everyone.



Beverley is a historic market town known for its Gothic minster, Georgian townhouses, quality shops and restaurants and rolling Grasslands.



Driffield is a friendly market town with a good range of shops and cafes. Explore the canal which is close to the railway station or visit the weekly market on a Thursday.

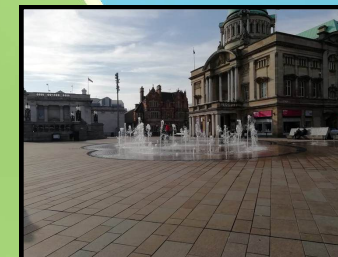
